The past year has seen considerable growth in the organisation, with increased profile in the community, employing a mentor coordinator to assist the Case Manager, and securing funding to enable the match numbers to increase. Recently Hastings District Council generously offered office space to house the growing team under one roof.

I would like to thank the hard work of the Board members, and our volunteer mentors, for your contribution, time, vision and professionalism. I also thank the staff for their hard work and dedication. Lead by Patricia Small, and assisted by Bonnie Llewellyn and recently we welcomed Kath Boyd in the role of mentor coordinator. They offer complimentary skills to the organisation, thus strengthening stability for the future.

A number of successful events occurred this year that have not only raised much needed funds but also the profile of BBBS. Large billboards were erected around Napier and Hastings cities encouraging people from the community to become Mentors, and to raise our profile. We were fortunate to be recipients of funds from a successful quiz night held at Lindisfarne College, organised by the hard working Rotarians from the Stortford Lodge Rotary Club. We organised a 'sold out' premiere movie night and attended the International Mandela Day. The mentees and mentors have enjoyed themselves with a number of events including a Christmas party at Splash Planet, picnic at Ocean Spa pools, and two trips to Laser Force.

Recently staff, and three board members, including myself attended the Big Brothers Big Sisters annual conference in Wellington. It was a great opportunity to meet staff and committee members from other regions, and to share the wealth of knowledge from the 13 regions around New Zealand.

My sincere thanks to all of our funders, both big and small, and to the organisations who have partnered with BBBS to offer discounted prices for our mentors and mentees (refer to page seven). Without your generous support we couldn't deliver the much needed mentoring programme in Hawke's Bay. We are currently working on a strategy to seek sponsorship from the business community to release employees for two hours a week to mentor a child, and to sponsor the cost of managing a match.

The year as Chairman has gone fast; I have enjoyed the challenge, and I am excited about the future of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Hawkes Bay. As I hand the reins to Carl Southwick I know the organisation will be lead positively through the next growth phase. The feedback from our young people, their caregivers and our mentors has been uplifting, and served to remind me why BBBS plays an important role in our community. The benefit of one hour, once a week has profound outcomes for our young children in Hawke's Bay.

ABBIE AND AALIYAH

Aayliah (mentee): "Me and Abbie get on like a house on fire; I have learnt a lot from Abbie, she helps me with bullying, talks about healthy eating and gives me wise advice. Abbie takes me places I wouldn't normally go. I want Abbie to be my Big Sister forever."

I have been able to support Aaliyah through any questions she has and provide advice where I can. I have seen her grow in confidence and enjoy hearing about her week and all the great things she has done. Aaliyah is now making conversations with more positive thoughts."

Rachel (Aalliyah's mother): "Aaliyah has a lot more confidence since being on the programme and matched with Abbie, she is willing to give new things a go. Twelve months ago she wouldn't consider doing half the things she does now, and she is a happier girl. It is good to see the bond she has with Abbie. They do fun things together."

2018/2019 PROGRAMME EVALUATION


We use our Programme Outcome Evaluation (POE) tool annually to evaluate the impact mentoring is having on young people and how the young people, their families and mentors rate the experience.


Data compiled from reports completed for 2018 - 2019 matches gave some compelling results!


- 100% of parents reported their child benefited from mentoring
- 100% of volunteers recommend the mentoring experience
- 96% of young people had increased self confidence since knowing their mentor
- 81% of mentors reported noticing an improvement in their young person's decision making abilities.
- 85% of young people were doing better in class.
- 73% of young people had improved relationships with their family.

Across 21 categories in confidence, competence and caring, young people showed improvement in all 21 categories.


